### Fuel-efficient cook stove, Uganda

Cook stoves dramatically improve indoor air quality - improving health and saving money or time that would otherwise be spent on purchasing or collecting fuel wood. The environment benefits too, by helping to reduce emissions and save trees from being cut down.

### Fireless cooker, Uganda

Fireless cookers can cut cooking time in half, reducing fuel use, saving trees and saving money for families in Uganda.

### Charcoal briquettes, Uganda

Train 10 women to make briquettes using free and readily available waste material. It will save trees from being cut down for charcoal production and money that can be spent on other essentials. Ref: 162 \$

Nalubula Madiina Ssememina lives in Nalukolongo village, Uganda. She attended an A Rocha sack gardening workshop and now has two sack gardens. She used to spend 1,500 shillings on vegetables every time she cooked, but by growing her own, she saves 30,000 shillings each month. She invests the money she saves in her hair salon and so it brings in a better income, enabling her to support herself and her young daughter. (Craig Mercer)

### Bio-sand water filter, Uganda

Bio-sand water filters reduce deforestation and help to provide clean, safe drinking water for communities in Kampala. Based on a cheap and easy-to-use technology, the filters remove 99% of pathogens and parasites from any water source without the need for chemical treatment or boiling. **Ref: 67** S\$125

### Beehive, Kenya

Give a farmer in Dakatcha Woodland Important Bird Area a hive and beekeeping training, equipping a sustainable source of income using the forest's rich resources. **Ref: 287** S\$150

### Guinea pig rearing, Peru

Helping 'at risk' children in a Peruvian youth club to breed, care for and sell guinea pigs, provides a sustainable source of income for the project, and helps the children learn new skills, developing their confidence and self-esteem.

### Planting 100 trees, Kenya

By planting trees, ASSETS beneficiaries can actively help to restore degraded areas of the threatened dry coastal forest ecosystem. They can help improve the local soil and water quality and they can help provide a safe habitat for wildlife. Ref: 292 5580

### Tree-nursery training day, Uganda

Train 10 community members around Kampala to prepare seedbeds and create their own tree nurseries. The trees help to mitigate against climate change and provide a source of income for the family. Ref: 228 5\$35

### Bio-sand filter training for a church or community, Uganda

Invest in a community with five days of training, allowing 30 people in Uganda to learn how to construct bio-sand water filters, as well as giving five filters for use by the church or community members. Participation can offer 150 people access to clean, safe drinking water, save €4,700 in charcoal costs and medical fees and prevent 90 trees from being cut down each year. Ref: 564 \$\$2,000

### Bees and trees, Kenya

A Rocha Kenya's beekeeping programme is working with 100 farmers across five villages in Dakatcha Woodland. Equip a representative from each village with a beehive and training, and enable ASSETS beneficiaries to plant 250 native trees in and around the nearby Arabuko-Sokoke Forest. Ref: 563 S\$1,000

### Forest restoration. Kenya

**Enable ASSETS beneficiaries** to plant 1,250 native trees in and around the Arabuko-Sokoke Forest to restore degraded areas of this threatened dry coastal forest ecosystem.
